Services Selection Board (SSB) is an organization that assesses the candidates for becoming officers into the Indian Armed Forces. The Board evaluates the suitability of the candidate for becoming an officer using a standardized protocol of evaluation system which constitutes of personality and intelligence tests and interviews. An SSB comprises of a panel of assessors who are officers in Indian Armed Forces and having their specializations as Psychologists, Group Testing Officers and Interviewing Officers. There are ten Service Selection Boards across India, out of which three boards are for Indian Army, four boards are for Indian Air Force and three boards for Indian Navy. SSB is a 5–6 days evaluation process (Wikipedia).
